Holistic Health

(Personal, Social and Emotional Development, Physical Development, Mindfulness, Emotional Literacy, Wellbeing Rights Respecting, Individual Needs) As the weather gets nicer, we will be spending more time outdoors to experience the weather changes and witness the spring flowers blossoming. We will be filling our planters and planting wildflowers. We are playing the Freeze Dance song before dinner and tea to help our children to learn routine. Our art activities stem from our spring theme and creating with natural resources. We are sharing lots of books in nursery and encouraging our children to explore books independently.
